

The number of schools with health graduates has stayed steady since 2015. However, continued graduate growth means **the median number of health** grads per institution has increased by 11%.
















Despite being one of the largest programs, **only 6% of Registered Nursing programs were offered online.** Why? The field's necessary practical training happens at the associate level.
